#### THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

St. Mary's, Mulberry Street, was founded in 1794 in the centre of what was then the poorest quarter of Manchester. It is now thought to be one of the oldest post Reformation Catholic churches founded as a church in England. The Relief Act allowing Catholic churches to be built again as churches was passed in 1791. The building of St. Mary's was begun in 1792. The church's vital connection with the most ancient Christian traditions of Manchester, and its uninterrupted service to the city since its foundation, make it one of the most beloved institutions in Manchester.



## MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

November is a month dedicated to remembering and praying for the souls of the faithful departed, the month of the Holy Souls. In the Catholic Church, this period begins with All Saints' Day on November 1st, a celebration of all the saints, known and unknown. The following day, All Souls' Day, is a solemn commemoration of all the faithful departed.

During this month, Catholics are encouraged to offer prayers, Masses, and good works for the souls in purgatory. Purgatory is a state of purification after death for those who die in God's grace but have not yet been fully purified. The Church teaches that our prayers and sacrifices can help alleviate the suffering of these souls and hasten their entry into heaven.

The month of November provides an opportunity for us to reflect on our own mortality and the importance of living a virtuous life. It also reminds us of the power of prayer and the interconnectedness of all souls, both living and departed. By offering prayers for the Holy Souls, we not only help them but also deepen our own faith and hope in the resurrection.

Throughout the month of November the Masses here at St Mary's will be celebrated each day for the Holy Souls, and in particular for all those whose names that are placed before the Altar of the Pietà. If you wish your loved ones to be included in these celebrations of Holy Mass, please put their names and a Mass offering in the envelopes at the back of the church.



# PHASE ONE Essential Works £250,000 [COMPLETED 2023]



Phase One of the Restoration works of St Mary's Church and Presbytery took place last summer and were completed at cost of £250,000. Thanks to your generosity to Saint Mary's over the last few years, and in particular this past year or so, and with the help of some successful bids for grants, we have been able to undertake and pay for these essential works to preserve the fabric of the church and presbytery. We offer particular thanks to those who have made specific donations towards these works. The Phase One Essential Works mainly consisted in stopping the ingress of water, particularly when there were heavy downpours of rain, and making the church water tight. This year we will continue our fundraising efforts, by appealing to the generosity of

our fundraising efforts, by appealing to the generosity of parishioners and visitors, and applying for grants where we can, so that we can move forward with the restoration project of Saint Mary's Church and Presbytery.

# PHASE TWO Fire Detection System & Church Organ £80,000 [COMPLETED 2024]

**Phase Two** of the Restoration works has been the installation of the first part of a Fire Detection Alarm system and an Emergency Lighting System in the church and the presbytery at the cost of £35,000. We have also had our thirty year old church organ rebuilt with new digital technology at a cost of £45,000.

# PHASE THREE Rainwater Redirection & Re-roofing £120,000 [In Progress AUTUMN 2024]

Recent investigations have established that the majority of rainwater from the church & presbytery roofs is carried through the interior of the buildings, from front to rear. Water is collected in a pipe which passes through the rear wall of the Upper Room and into the neighbouring pub. Increased rainfall, particularly downpours of large amounts of water in a short period of time, means that this arrangement is not sustainable. A blockage of the pipe in the cellar of the pub last year resulted in a major flood in the church and presbytery causing a fair amount of damage to the fabric of the church and the presbytery.

**Phase Three** of the Restoration works provides a significant first step towards the creation of a new drainage system that is entirely independent of the neighbouring pub, the works having been informed by a detailed drainage survey.

The works in this phase of the restoration comprise of:

 New rainwater pipes and associated below-ground drainage, connecting to existing drains at the front of the buildings; and the redirection of water from the front roofs of the old presbytery to eliminate internal pipes;



As well as other essential works on the old presbytery roof:

• Re-roofing the front section of the old presbytery as the existing coverings were in poor condition & uninsulated; re-making leaking lead-lined gutters and abutments; and improving the flashings and weather-proofing to the presbytery chimney.

With this photo, you can see the excellent standard of new lead work on the roof.

The contractor for this phase of the restoration works, Heritage Conservation, **began the works on site on 2nd September**, which will take twelve weeks to complete.

These works will cost £120,000 to undertake. Thank you for your continued generosity.
