PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO YORK

We are organising a parish day pilgrimage to York on the August Bank Holiday Monday, 31st August. The Day Pilgrimage will be a lovely opportunity to have a day out together and to join in the Annual York Pilgrimage in honour of **St Margaret Clitherow**, one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales, to attend Holy Mass and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at the Oratory Church, and to have a little time to visit the historic city of York. The cost of the day pilgrimage by coach is £20 for adults and £10 for children.

St. Mary's, Mulberry Street, was founded in 1794 in the centre of what was then the poorest quarter of Manchester.

It is now thought to be one of the oldest post Reformation Catholic churches founded as a church in England. The Relief Act allowing Catholic churches to be built again as churches was passed in 1791 and the building of St. Mary's was begun in 1792.

The church's vital connection with the most ancient Christian traditions of Manchester, and its uninterrupted service to the city since its foundation, make it one of the most beloved institutions in Manchester.

**St Margaret
Clitherow**
(1556-1586)

was an English
Catholic martyr
who lived during
the reign of Queen
Elizabeth I.

Born in York,
she converted to
Catholicism after
her marriage to
John Clitherow,
a prosperous
butcher. Despite
laws banning the
Catholic faith, she
bravely sheltered
priests in her home,
risking her life to
protect them.

Arrested for
harbouring Catholic
clergy, Margaret
refused to plead in
court, preventing
her children from
being forced to
testify. She was
sentenced to death
by pressing and
executed on
25 March 1586.

Canonised in 1970,
she is remembered
for her
extraordinary
courage, faith, and
selfless devotion.

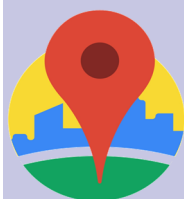
PARISH FUNDRAISING - PIETY STALL

RESTORATION OF SAINT MARY'S CHURCH AND PRESBYTERY

Thanks to your generosity to Saint Mary's over the last few years, and with the help of some successful bids for grants, we have been able to undertake **£450,000** worth of essential works to preserve the fabric of the church and presbytery. This year we are continuing our fundraising efforts, by appealing to the ongoing generosity of parishioners and visitors, and applying for grants where we can, so that we can move forward with the restoration of Saint Mary's Church & Presbytery.

We have been working with our parish architect over the last four or five years and we now have a very good idea of the works that need to be undertaken and we have had many of the necessary surveys done. The further works in the coming years will be needed to bring all the external fabric of the church up to a standard in order to preserve it for many years to come as well as restoring the interior of our beautiful church.

Further meetings are taking place at this time to determine the next phase of works and, whilst it was envisaged that the next phase might take place this year, following discussions with the Property Department of the diocese, it has been decided that we try to do a larger package of works next year. Doing more works at the same time will, in the long run, be more cost effective. Once we have more details, we will update everyone in due course through the Parish Newsletter. Meanwhile, we are trying to raise **£500,000** towards the costs of these works.

For any donations you give to the Restoration Fund, please consider, if you pay income tax, gift aiding your donation so that the parish can claim a further 25% on your donation. This will make a real difference to our restoration project.

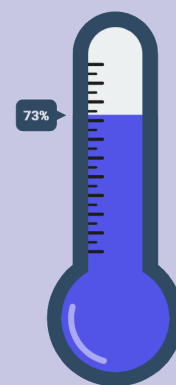
